## Soul Stories

We'll listen to, and discuss, a short wisdom tale selected from the multi-cultural collection, Doorways to the Soul, compiled by a UU professional storyteller (ISBN: 9781556357404). It is not necessary to purchase the book. Julie will post a copy of the story on the church bulletin board for a few weeks. The book author allows for one copy to be posted in a common area for the purpose of sharing and discussing the stories.

In August, we listened to a Sufi tale about searching for buried treasure that was never found but the seekers found other, more valuable, things along the way. We talked about how we seek spiritual and other treasures in our lives through daily effort and discipline.

The story for September 13 is "A Drop of Honey," from Burma and Thailand, about small things causing big problems. We'll ponder the role of a drop of honey in the interdependent web of life, in social justice work, and in our relationships.

We will meet on the second Thursday of each month this fall as follows: September 13, October 11, and November 8, 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. at Channing.

## President's Column



Orioles games have rain delays. Channing gatherings have light bulb delays.

A kitchen lighting issue held up the August meeting of Soul Stories for a few minutes past the intended start time. Someone noticed the light problem, and the facilities team members (that would be one hundred percent of the meeting attendees, except for the leader) walked around the church and held a brief discussion. As the Soul Stories leader, I could have fumed. How dare a light bulb take precedence over the church president's carefully-prepared remarks on grand philosophical themes?

But, as the Sufi story we would read reminded us, much of spiritual life is not glamorous. We must engage in regular practices such as worship attendance, meditation, journaling, and discussion groups before we can hope to earn the treasures of spiritual fulfillment. One does not immediately become the Buddha.

Church life consists of many mundane tasks that support Sunday morning worship and our other ministries. We fix the lights, clean the toilets, balance the bank accounts, fold the bulletins. These jobs could function as a spiritual practice. We learn that smaller tasks prepare us for the larger moments in life.

Eventually, the facilities team disbanded their meeting and returned to their seats. After Soul Stories, the facilities meeting quickly resumed in the foyer. One of the attendees looked at

the church president and joked about "the facilities team resuming their meeting." The church president smiled and departed, grateful for those who take care of the chores that allow for the magic of Channing Memorial Church to touch souls week after week.

One chore area that needs more support are our church cleaners (contact Diana M. to help). If you search on Google for "spirituality of cleaning," you will find plenty of resources- some Buddhist, a few Christian- on how to turn your cleaning routine into a spiritual practice. Perhaps you will be inspired to, metaphorically, scrub away your inner demons on the toilets. I learned of a cleaning company in Cape Town that provides its janitorial services with a spiritual twist, with themes of love, humility, and presence. They also teach others in workshops about cleaning as a practice for healing the painful past in South Africa, transforming people from abusers to protectors. ## "To You I Give"

Last month, I put forth an article titled, "From You I Receive." If you missed it, I will summarize: "Come to church to be nurtured." And I hope you *are* coming to church-- to learn, to be with friends and to receive support. So what about the next line of hymn 402, "To you I give?" While I wrote that people don't come to church to be on a committee, it's also true that, with the exception of a few paid staff, our church is run by volunteers. "What should I do to serve?" is an important question.

It may be that the answer to that question is "Nothing." If you are new or are going through a tough time, just "let church be church" for awhile. Come to hear a good sermon, to sit peacefully or to be inspired by music, and let that be enough. Receive the gift when you need to.

When you are able, look around a bit-- there are things that need to be done for Channing to continue to be the place that we love. It can be overwhelming to think about, and a challenge to make it not seem like a chore. In the last few years, some of us have begun to think of church work as part of our spiritual growth instead of as a duty. I can see it when folks sign up for Snack Squad, excited to keep us fed and happy after the service. My kids' RE teachers commit to a year of co-teaching, not to pass on dogma, but to keep our children and youth excited and questioning. (One teacher told me, "I think I'm learning more than the kids!") I try to do church work I am interested in, that satisfies something in me as well as getting a job done. (And I occasionally clean the bathrooms, too.)

We all have different gifts to offer. After you have let Channing nurture you, I hope you will grow in nurturing our church.
