What's Your Mission?



Search Committee Update

The CMC Settled Minister Search Committee has been hard at work the last two months. As most of you know, the details of what the committee is doing must be confidential. However, we can, and intend to, keep the congregation apprised of where we are in the process. We had our retreat and process kickoff with our Ministerial Settlement Representative in September.

Subsequently we have been meeting weekly to put in place the many logistical and paperwork pieces needed. Thanks to last year's search committee who did a tremendous job in pulling together our survey, packet and Congregational Record. The latter two essentially combine to provide a detailed profile of the congregation.

Thanks also to all who participated in the small group Cottage Meetings or otherwise provided input. Your feedback is being incorporated into the above documents which we are reviewing and updating as needed. In addition, local neutral pulpits for precandidating weekends have been arranged.

An important congregational workshop, designed to promote inclusive thinking in the search process, called "Beyond
