
Water Communion Service

President's Column



When our children were growing up, I learned something about crepe myrtle trees that turned out to be pretty important. It's not that they are covered in large, showy blossoms in summer or that their leaves turn from dark green to shades of red and orange and yellow-gold in fall. Nor is it that they are easy to care for, drought resistant, cold resistant, and deer resistant. What turned out to be important is that they are not teenage-driver resistant.

To say I didn't realize that a car, being driven in reverse, accidentally heading toward the edge of the driveway, was-

n't going to cause damage to the tree standing in its way is pretty silly. I expected that. What I didn't expect was my reaction. I didn't think of it as a mistake or a problem. Instead, I saw it for what it was—an experience that offered lessons to be learned.

I have, figuratively, backed over many crepe myrtles in my time and had always been quick to brand the experiences solely as mistakes. Usually with a capital "M." This meant I'd spend more energy on regret and recrimination than on discerning the lessons to be learned. I had no grace or understanding for myself. But I did have it for that rookie driver. The crepe myrtle's most important lesson was for me.

One of the blessings of a faith community is its offer of a place of grace where one can sort through one's experiences, where questions can be asked, assumptions can be challenged, and feelings can be felt, all in an atmosphere of support and non-judgment. The striving for personal and spiritual development is understood as both uplifting and messy, and it has a lot to do with what lessons we bring into our future.

Unlike other spaces where we can explore what it means to be human, a faith community undergirds our efforts with a net of support woven from strands of shared values, spiritual enrichment, and compassion. It is a place where, by just showing up, we are reminded of our core beliefs. Here, we can be reassured that we are inherently worthy whether we struggle and fail or struggle and prevail. It is a rich loamy soil where we can bring who we are, and where we have been, and tend to the work of growth.

Yes, I've backed over crepe myrtles but didn't that open spaces of full sun for something else to grow? The refrain to Leonard Cohen's song *Anthem* goes,

Ring the bells that still can ring. Forget your perfect offering. There is a crack in everything. That's how the light gets in.

So, what happened to the knocked-over crepe myrtle? Joe tried to dig it up and replace it with bright red Knock Out® roses. But the crepe myrtle wasn't having any of

that. The following spring, there it was, sending slender, woody stems with showy pink blooms through the growing canes of the rose bushes. Now, next to our driveway grows a genuinely unique and beautiful shrub with pink and red blossoms flowering on intertwined branches with dark green leaves, some of which will drop when autumn arrives, and others will remain, changing to shades of red and orange and yellow-gold.
