## Worship Spotlight— Interview with Ostara H., WA\*\*



Ostara was raised as a Lutheran in Minnesota. She grew away from the faith and, as a young adult, became interested in women's spirituality, Paganism, and Unitarian Universalism.

After Ostara and husband Dan moved to Howard County, they started looking for churches. Ostara says that she felt ill-equipped to pass on her spirituality to young children and decided that "now is the time." They found Channing in 2004 and liked the "quiet spirituality," the emphasis on ritual and liturgy, and the people.

Ostara has been a "WA" since 2010. She loves the many aspects of the work: public speaking, poetry and story telling, setting the energy of the service. She says, "It calls on the whole of me— intellectual, creative, intuitive— to know what the congregation needs this week."

Ostara says that being a worship associate is a great way to support the minister, and she also likes working with lay people and guest ministers. She is proud of helping with Rev. Susan's farewell service, and also with leading meaningful summer worship services.

## **Channing Book Club Meetings for March**




Saturday, March 7 10-1130 am Thursday, March 12 10-11:30 am

The parking lot is immediately on your right. Overflow spaces available at other locations in the Village Center.

#### From Baltimore:

Take 70W to Rt. 29 south.

Take Rt. 108 West.

Turn right onto Columbia Road.

Turn right at the first light on Old Annapolis Road.

You will be behind the Dorsey Search Village Center. Take the third entry road on the left (Old Route 108).

The parking lot is immediately on your right. Overflow spaces available at other locations in the Village Center.
