Minister's Column

Dear Channing members and friends,



During any snowstorm that lasted from evening throughout the night, my sister and I would watch the clock with great anticipation. When midnight hit, we jumped out of our seats, rushed out the door, and saw – often before anyone else in the neighborhood – a sheet of untouched snow. It was magical!

Nothing but a smooth, white blanket covering the ground. We walked around, creating the very first footprints, packing the very first snowballs.

Reflecting on these memories reminds me of a Mary Oliver poem and her own experience with the untouched and the beauty that arises with it in her poem, "Passing by the Unworked Field."

Queen Anne's lace is hardly prized but all the same it isn't idle look how it stands straight on its thin stems how it scrubs its white faces with the rags of the sun how it makes all the loveliness it can.

That Queen Anne's lace – a weed, not prized as a daffodil or a crocus, yet filling that untouched space with beauty, its humble attributes making all the loveliness it can. Now, in these cold, dark, January days, we are not offered that unexpected beauty of a flower, but we are surrounded by the winter's own, unique magic. The cold, chilly untouched pieces of this winter canvas. While we hunker down to stay warm, let us take note of our foggy breath in the untouched air, the coziness within our jackets as we take the first step from the warmth of our homes into the frosty chill of the winter.

The Board met on December 21st. Issues addressed were:

Adopt-a-Drain

Julie F. requested that the Board consider adopting a drain through the Howard Eco Works organization. The Board agreed to have Channing sponsor 2 drains, near the Park Ave. office, and to put out a request for volunteers to work with Julie on this activity.

Meeting in Person

After much discussion, the Board decided to cancel inperson worship through the end of January due to the sharp rise in Covid infections in the area.

The Board agreed to hire Stuart D. as a contracted technical assistant for hybrid worship services when they resume, hopefully in February.

The Board agreed to the request from Rev. Jane and the Worship Team to change the start of worship at the Robinson Nature Center to 10:30am AND to rent for an extra hour each Sunday to allow for more time for the technical set up. Channing will rent from 8-12 each Sunday we have worship at the Robinson Center. (Board Bits - continued from p. 2)

Space Team Report

The Space Team continues to search for suitable space. They reported on a space they found on Grace Drive and one on Corporate Court. The Board decided not to pursue the space on Grace Drive due to the distance from Baltimore County and its lack of storage space. The Corporate Court Space was ruled out due to its aesthetics.

Strategic Plan

The Board will share the Strategic Plan with the congregation, and then Kathleen Razmus will convene a meeting of the council of committees to discuss the plan.

Unfortunately, all I have to report at this time is that we've had some near misses. The search is difficult for a number of reasons, including, but not limited to our budget, our physical space needs, and an unfortunate reluctance of Howard County landlords to rent to churches. Soul Matters Small Group January: Living with Intention


Channing Care Team

Social Justice Advocacy

After the MD General Assembly's successful override of Governor Hogan's vetoes in December 2021 of the Dignity Not Detention bill and the Driver Privacy bill, both of which are now law, the legislators are busy pre-filing bills. There will be two immigrants' rights bills that the <u>UU Legislative Ministry of MD</u> will be supporting in the upcoming session: Universal Representation and Health Care Expansion for Immigrant Families.

Universal Representation, which was previously introduced in the 2021 session has been pre-filed. **It is <u>HB0114</u> / <u>SB0129</u>**. The bills will be considered in the House Judiciary and Senate Judicial Proceedings Committees.

Health Care Expansion for Immigrant Families will be filed during the regular session.
