Dear Channing members and friends,



Many of us are still reeling after the results of the election. Throughout the past month, I've heard works of shock, anger, and sorrow expressed by many of you. In response, we've lit candles of concern, we've prayed words of hope, and we've lifted our voices in songs of lamentation. We are grieving for our nation, for our future, for our at-risk beloveds. This is an

experience of grief that we may hold deep in our bones, coupled with despair and frustration. And now, just as what felt like a nightmare has become our reality, I call us to join together in action.

"What can we do?" I have heard. "What can we do now?" Amidst fear and exhaustion, I offer: action. This is a long-term struggle; we are preparing for the years, not months, ahead of us. This is not a time of despair, but of perseverance and a call towards allyship. And it is not just practical work, it is deep and intentional soul work. So may we be grounded in the energy of change that rejuvenates us over and over again. I am reminded of a well-known quote: "The arc of the universe is long, but it bends towards justice." So may we bend that arc, knowing that we have persevered through difficult political situations in the past, and that we can draw upon the wisdom of our ancestors to do it again.

Our values as Unitarian Universalists are at risk, and it is our responsibility to make sure that these values persevere, protecting and uplifting the generations to come. We can act through our pockets, donating to organizations such as Planned Parenthood, the ACLU, or PFLAG. Likewise, we can volunteer at these and other organizations. We can support our values through influencing legislation, supporting initiatives addressing climate change, immigration reform, reproductive rights, and gender affirming care. In doing so, we support this sacred planet we call home, care for those who came here seeking safety, protect those who need abortion access, and defend our LGBTQIA+ beloveds. Financial sup-

We did it! Again! This year's CMC auction was a smashing success. We raised over \$6000 for the Church, with a lion's share coming from the live auction, which had over 50 people in attendance.

The Board received an exciting update from the Sabbatical Coordinator (Kris): An offer has been made to a candidate for the Anchor Minister position. Contract negotiations are underway and further details will be shared with the congregation soon.



The restroom renovation project is also making forward progress: A contract has been signed with ColCon, Inc., to execute the design proposal that will be sent to the county. Once the permit is received from the county, the Board plans to authorize commencement of the work. We also received assurance that the rough-in for the sewer pipe and water line to the main level will be entirely under the floor— i.e., there will be no visible evidence of the rough-in in the narthex.

In church leadership news, the Board was happy to learn that Ken K. is stepping into the role of Usher Coordinator. (Thank you to Ken!)

Directions from the North on Route 29: Take Route 29 to Route 100 East, take first Exit Long Gate Parkway to stop sign (keep left at split). When traffic is clear, go straight across to Meadowbrook Lane, past the Park and Ride to the stop sign, turn right onto Sybert Drive. The church will be on your right.

Directions from the South on Route 29: Take Route 29 to Route 108, head East on Route 108 to first traffic light (Bendix Road), turn left onto Edgar Road; at stop sign turn right, then in two blocks turn left onto Parkvale Road. Continue to stop sign, then turn left onto Sybert Drive. The church will be on your right.
